## 'TOO-EASY PEACH COBBLER

Prep Time: 15 Min.
Cook Time: 10 Min.
Servings: 4 to 6

If you have some extra vanilla ice cream in the freezer, try making this peach cobbler to go with it!

## Ingredients

|| 2 (16-ounce) packages frozen peaches, thawed and drained
1/4 cup all-purpose flour, divided 5 white bread slices
$11 / 4$ cups sugar

$1 / 2$ cup butter or margarine, melted
1 large egg

## Preparation

1. Stir together peaches and 2 tablespoons flour. Place in a lightly greased 8 -inch-square baking dish.
|| 2. Trim crusts from bread slices; cut each slice into 5 strips. Arrange bread strips over fruit mixture.
\| 3. Stir together remaining 2 tablespoons flour, sugar, and next 2 ingredients; drizzle over bread strips.
|l 4. Bake at $350^{\circ}$ for 35 to 45 minutes or until golden and bubbly.
